Cudmore Grove Country Park Restoration

Q Is my visit to Cudmore Grove Country Park likely to be affected?

A Predator fencing will be installed to protect wildlife on the borrow dyke and grazing marsh.

Access will be maintained for walkers but some diversions may be put in place whilst works are being carried out. Large machinery will be on site.

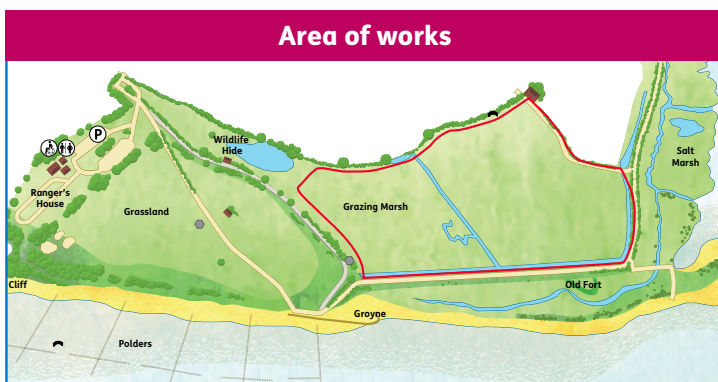
Q Will I need to keep my dog on the lead?

A Yes, please keep dogs on leads in any areas where work is taking place for their protection and that of the workers. Please observe and follow any safety signs.

Q How long will the work be taking place?

A The installation of the fencing is planned to take place in early autumn for a period of around one month. Some follow-up work may occur as part of ongoing habitat management.

The ambitious programme of works at the Essex Country Parks will be taking place over many years to boost nature recovery for the future.
